Mimuro-Machi, Nanao-City, Ishikawa Prefecture

In these areas facing Nanao Bay, peoples were doing not only fishing, but also rice farming by crossing over to Notojima island on the oppositeside by ships. Namely, they were making lives by half-agriculture and half-fishing.

Shipwrights were used to build wooden ships using woods produced in nearby forests and at Mimuro boathouses were standing in a row for the storage of these ships.

Lifestyles have been changed with the change of the times, and people hardly cross over to Notojima Island anymore.

Speaking of fishing vessels, ships made of reinforced plastic which are capable of mass production with cheaper cost are widely used now and the wooden ships cannot be seen anymore.

The shipwrights remaining at present in this area are only 2 persons, namely the Sugimoto Brothers who have been handed down the shipbuilding technology over seven generations from the Edo period.
